New Club Logo and Apparel

We have now completed the first step in the Club's new marketing campaign with the design of a new logo. The process began a year and a half ago with the formation of a marketing committee that sought solicitations from select Club members and familiar outsiders with expertise in graphic design. After a year of disappointing results the board of directors hired a marketing consultant to create a professional logo that would convey our message of year round fun, excitement and sophistication (just like us) in a simple and attractive manner.



The various elements of the design include the Mid-Hudson Bridge which is the standard icon for this region and in this case symbolizes a gateway to distant adventures in snow-capped mountains. The water and city skyline are further geographic representations of Poughkeepsie. The sun adds color and interest while symbolizing four-season action. The letter fonts were chosen because of their elegance as well as being easy to read. The primary colors will be blue and white. We hope that our new logo will project a positive image and be an important step to generate more interest in what we have to offer.

You will soon be able to display your HVSC pride with awesome, new Club apparel. The tee shirts are in and they look great. They are available in white and grey and feature a digital printing procedure that embeds the ink into the fabric which is superior to screen printing. Look for them at meetings or activities. Within the next month we will be creating an online store where you will be able to order clothing such as fleece vests and jackets, turtlenecks, hats and dress shirts with an embroidered logo.

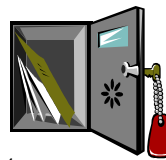

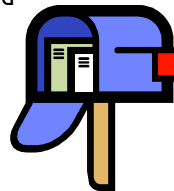

**From the Editor/Webmaster
Ski area ads for lift tickets**

It's October and you will notice on most pages of this newsletter ads appearing for local ski areas.

These ads will appear in the six "winter issues" of the Newsletter. In exchange for these ads those ski areas provide lift tickets which the club raffles to its membership at monthly meetings.



The only cost to the club is less than 20% of the printing cost for those issues (therefore less than 10% of the newsletter annual printing budget) plus the volunteer labor of the "Lift Ticket Lotto" chairman, Mark Searle, and the newsletter staff. Since the additional ads don't go over the one ounce limit, there is no increase in postage cost.



Whether the revenue to the club offsets this expense is a function of how many people come to meetings and participate in the raffle. The benefit to the members who do participate and win lift tickets is obvious. So come to the meetings, participate in the Lotto and perhaps you'll be skiing almost for free.

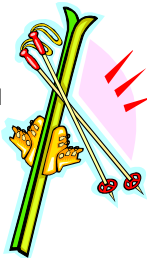

HOW TO IMPROVE YOUR SKIING OR RIDING

There are a few techniques that are proven to enhance one's skiing or riding abilities that many of us have most likely employed at one time or another during our skiing/riding careers. There's the tried and true method of practice. Simply doing it over and over and over again until, hopefully, it becomes second nature. For example, you probably tie your shoes without looking at them simply because you've done it so many times and your fingers have such a high degree of muscle memory. Hopefully, all of that practice allows you to get it right and your skill level improves. If not, then frustration sets in and ultimately one gives up. Not for lack of trying mind you but, simply because it doesn't work or it's not enjoyable. Something is missing. What is a person to do? As far as skiing or riding is concerned, (you're on your own with regard to tying your shoes) this is where your ski club gets involved. The HVSC can address, in a positive manner, the frustration you feel, the plateau that you seem to have reached and your perceived inability to make the leap from that plateau to a higher level of skiing and riding. Forget that "woe is me" attitude or the belief that you'll always be an intermediate – do something positive. The HVSC has the means to address the dilemma you may be experiencing.

HVSC WON'T SKI AT JIMINY

Jiminy Peak of Hancock, MA has informed the HVSC that they will no longer be supporting the club with lift tickets for the Lift Ticket Lotto and advertisements in the club newsletter. The reason offered by Jiminy management is because they have no record of club members skiing at Jiminy. Your club Board has pointed out to Jiminy management the many events and specific days that the club has been at Jiminy. However, Jiminy contends that since the club did not buy group tickets, they will not support the club.



As a result, your Board has decided that there will be no club sponsored events (Ski Improvement, club ski days) held at Jiminy Peak until such time that the management changes its stance on support for the HVSC.

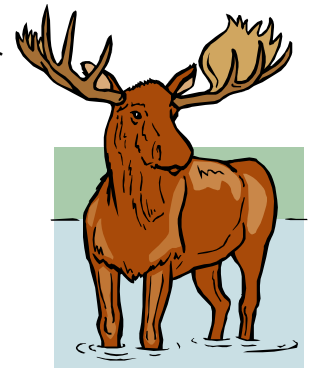

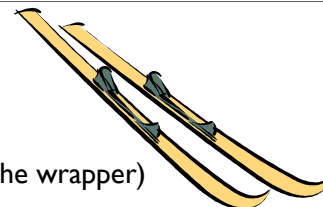

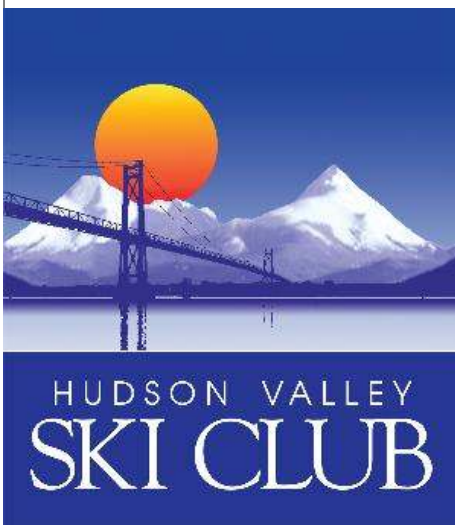
