## How to Improve Your Skiing or Riding

There are a few techniques that are proven to enhance one's skiing or riding abilities that many of us have most likely employed at one time or another during our skiing/riding careers. There's the tried and true method of practice. Simply doing it over and over again until, hopefully, it becomes second nature. For example, you probably tie your shoes without looking at them simply because you've done it so many times that your fingers have such a high degree of muscle memory. 

## The Future of the Club is in Your Hands!

We are rapidly approaching the Hudson Valley Ski Club's Annual Meeting on Wednesday April 3, 2013. At that time eligible voting members will elect officers and board members to direct the operation of the club. Terms for officers are for one year and the two of four board member positions open for election are for two years each. In addition, the annual meeting is when we normally entertain amendments to the club's bylaws necessary to adjust to changing times.

Are you interested in making a difference in your club? Do you have leadership abilities? Do you have a gift for administration or management? A Hudson Valley Ski Club officer or board position may be for you! In order to remain a vibrant and growing organization we must continually infuse the leadership of the club with new people; this means you!

A Nomination/Election Committee will identify and recruit candidates. To be eligible, candidates, other than for club president, must be a voting member for one year. A candidate for president needs to be a voting member for two years. The committee will announce the slate of candidates at the second regular member meeting in March and publish it in the April newsletter. Nominations will opened from the floor at the meeting at which the slate of candidates is presented to the membership and at the annual meeting.

The Board of Directors is not proposing any changes to the bylaws. Regular members may propose amendments to the bylaws in writing to the President, or Vice-President. If deemed urgent, a member may propose amendments at any time. The proposed change(s) will be presented to the Constitution Committee who shall see that the amendment(s) is presented to the general membership at least one regular meeting and one newsletter prior to the meeting at which a vote will take place.
