Fred Schaeffer to present at July HVSC meeting!

At our July 3rd meeting, Fred Schaeffer (attorney, biker, local historian, photographer and former HVSC Member), will give a talk w/ photos, of how the Walkway Over the Hudson came to be. Fred was largely responsible for making it happen as well as the Rail Trail from the Walkway to Hopewell Junction.

Fred will talk about how an organization was formed and how he became Chairman of it and led it to create The Walkway Over the Hudson out of an abandoned railroad bridge, built in 1888. Fred will explain how \$40,000,000 was raised to pay for it. The Walkway now has around 600,000 visitors a year.


